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What happened in March?

Attendance Management Detailed Scrutiny review	Use of Resources Scrutiny Panel agreed the report on Attendance Management prepared by a sub-group of Councillors and forwarded their recommendations to Cabinet.
On-Street Parking	The Economy and Environment Scrutiny Panel examined issues about on-street parking in the Borough. The Panel received evidence from Halifax Society for the Blind and others who have been directly impacted by on-street parking and made a number of recommendations to Cabinet asking for an educational and awareness campaign to be undertaken.
