Corrine Kielty attended to provide an update on Ryburn Valley Greeenway (RVG) CK: The RVG Annual General Meeting was well attended and the majority of people were supportive. It has got this far because so many people have supported the project. Looking to build on the 350 people signed up already (presence at Sowerby Bridge market to help achieve this). Had a recent contact asking "how do I get on the route at the moment – lived in Sowerby Bridge 33 years and didn't know it existed". We need to keep going with the publicity machine and it is intended to organise a walk from Sowerby Bridge and involve the person who wrote about the history of the railway to do a talk. It won't be organised as such; will show people the route and need to make it clear people have to be able bodied to use it. As it stands at the moment, going to have to take people through Calder Valley Skip Hire though we are concerned about the effect on the Greenway of proposed chimney at the bottom, which would be level with the Greenway – have met with the people who are opposing the chimney and are supporting them. Don't think decision on incinerator final
