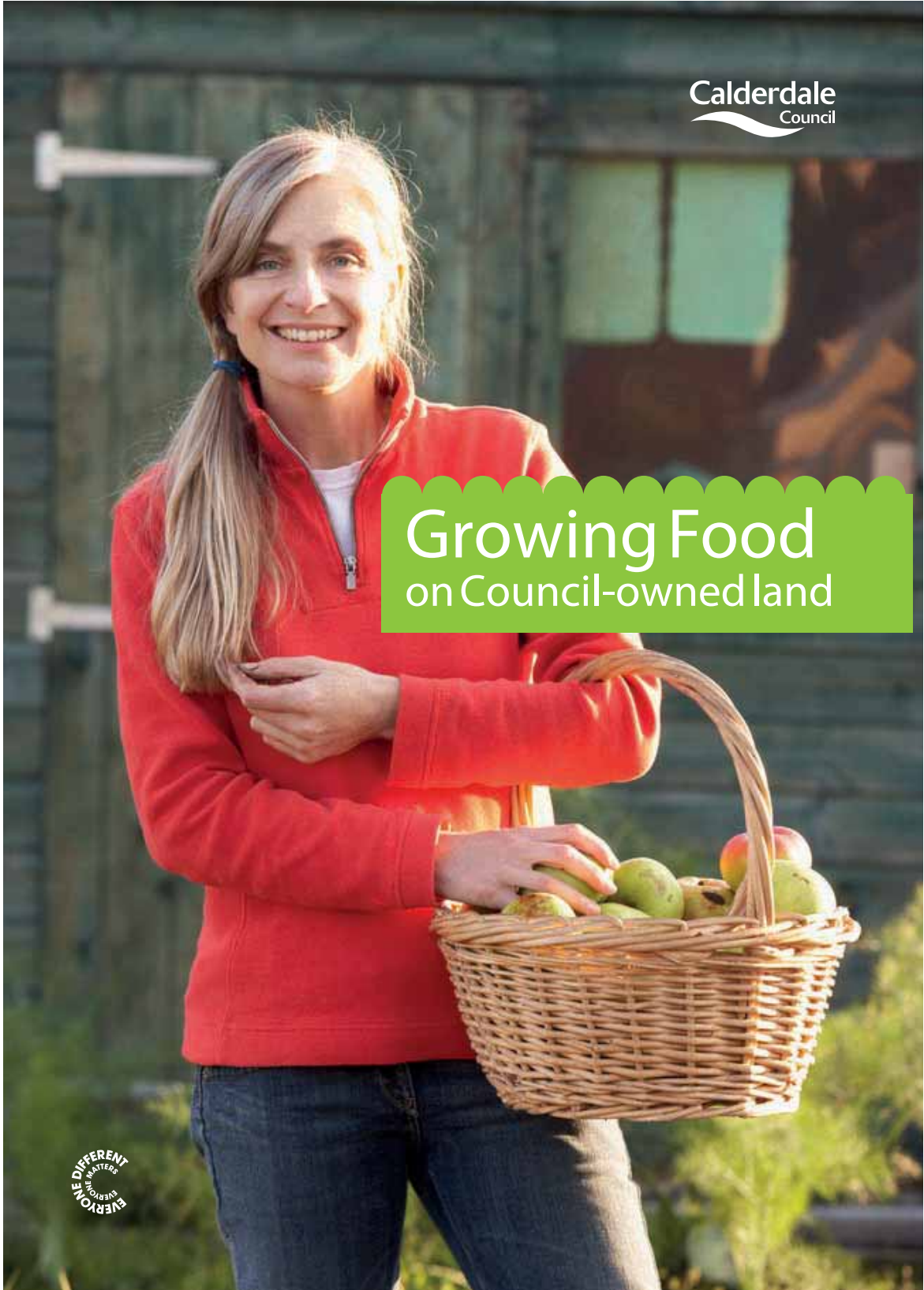

Growing Food on Council-owned land

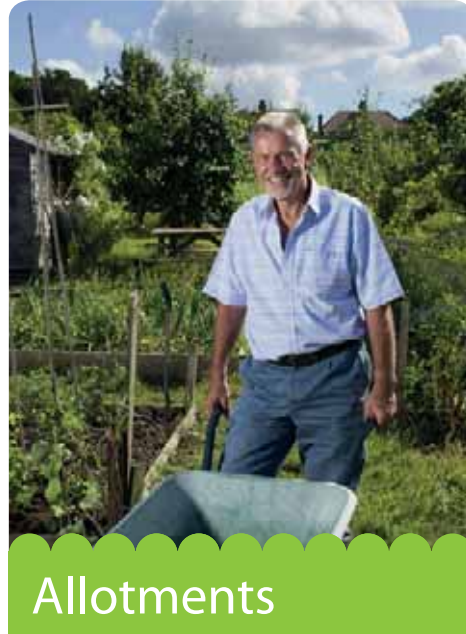
