**15 APPLICATION FOR THE GRANT OF A PREMISES LICENCE: 349
SALTERHEBBLE HILL, HALIFAX HX3 OQA**

The Assistant Director, Neighbourhoods submitted a written report seeking consideration of an application for the grant of a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003, where representations had been received from a member of the public.

The Licensing Sub Committee considered the report presented and representations made relating to:

- Prevention of Crime and Disorder;
- Prevention of Public Nuisance;

and the Applicant's proposals for dealing with those concerns as outlined in their proposed operating schedule namely CCTV inside and outside the premises;

and had due regard to the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the statutory guidance issued under section 182 of the Act, the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the relevant provisions of the Human Rights Act.

RESOLVED that the application for the grant of a Premises Licence for 349 Salterhebble Hill, Halifax HX3 OQA be approved subject to:

Supply of Alcohol (Off the Premises):
Monday to Saturday 07.00 to 23.00 hours
Sunday 08.00 to 23.00 hours

Open to the public:
Monday to Saturday 07.00 to 23.00 hours
Sunday 08.00 to 23.00 hours

and subject to the conditions which were consistent with the proposed operating schedule that no additional conditions regarding the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance were required.

The application was accepted because the Sub Committee considered that subject to the modified hours the Licensing Objectives were not undermined.

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The reason for the decision was that the Sub Committee took full consideration of the written objection received and the evidence they had heard. After hearing all the evidence Members considered that the decision reached was appropriate in order to promote the Licensing Objectives.

(All parties were advised that there was a right of appeal against the decision to the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the date of the decision).
