REPORT OF THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF NEIGHBOURHOODS

1. Reason for report

The Animal Welfare (Licensing of Activities Involving Animals) (England) Regulations 2018 will come in to force in England on 1st October 2018 and will replace the current licences made under the following Acts:

Animal Boarding Establishment Act 1963
Breeding of Dogs Act 1973 and 1991, as amended by the Breeding and Sale of Dogs (Welfare) Act 1999
Pet Animals Act 1951
Riding Establishments Acts 1964 and 1970

The Regulations will also remove the requirement for registration under the Performing Animals (Regulation) Act 1925, and replace it with a requirement for a licence

To Set Licensing Fees

2. Need for a Decision

Without the agreement of the committee the Authority will be unable to charge an application fee for licences under the Animal Welfare (Licensing of Activities Involving Animals) (England) Regulations 2018, the authority also is required to establish the procedure for Star Rating Appeals and a system for suspension, variation or revocation of a licence.

In setting fees, we should have regard to Open for business: LGA guidance on locally set licence fees, which sets out the steps that must be taken to set fair and reasonable fees, and explains the EU Services Directive upon which the LGA guidance is based. We should also have regard to the BEIS Guidance for Business on the Provision of Services Regulations. As with other areas of licensing, regard should also be had to the principles in the Regulators' Code. "Reasonable anticipated costs" will be fact specific and dependent on this Authority. The "Open for business: LGA guidance on locally set licence fees" guidance includes information on what could be considered reasonable.



3. Recommendation

3.1 Fees

Article 13, of the 20018 Regulations allows

A Local Authority may charge such fee as it considers necessary for -

- (a) the consideration of an application for the grant, renewal or variation of a licence including any inspection relating to that consideration, and for the grant, renewal or variation,
- (b) the reasonable anticipated costs of consideration of a licence holder's compliance with these Regulations and the licence conditions to which the licence holder is subject in circumstances other than those described in sub-paragraph (a) including any inspection relating to that consideration,
- (c) the reasonable anticipated costs of enforcement in relation to any licensable activity of an unlicensed operator, and
- (d) the reasonable anticipated costs of compliance with regulation 29 (Provision of information to the Secretary of State)

The fee charged for the consideration of an application for the grant, renewal or variation of a licence and for any inspection relating to that consideration must not exceed the reasonable costs of that consideration and related inspection.

Under the current Acts the discretionary annual charge is £106, it is proposed that the new Licensing fees should be divided in to a number of areas, these would be

Licence Application Fee (New applicant) – this will be for the reasonable anticipated cost of the application process, review of the activity history of the licensee, the licence inspection, travel to the premises, administration costs and review of licence documentation by a Senior Officer.

Licence Application Fee (Renewal or Transitional) – this will be for the reasonable anticipated cost of the application process, review of the activity history of the licensee, the licence inspection, travel to the premises, administration costs and review of licence documentation by a Senior Officer.

Licence Grant Fee – this will be for the reasonable anticipated cost of the Grant of the licence, a mid-term visit, to include, review of the activity history of the licensee, the visit, travel to the premises, administration costs and review of documentation by a Senior Officer, along with provision of information to the Secretary of State.

Variation of Licence – this will be for the reasonable anticipated cost for either a minor or major variation to the licence.

Start Rating Reassessment – this will be for the reasonable anticipated cost for review of the activity history of the licensee, the license inspection, travel to the premises, administration costs and review of license documentation by a Senior Officer.
