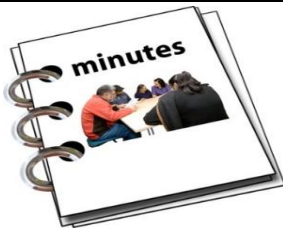
Welcome and Introductions

Lead the Way have done a lot of work in the 10 months the project has been going and have recently been confirmed to have a 1 year extension on the contract.

We have linked with Choice Volunteering - where a mentor supports a person with a Learning Disability to volunteer. Choice volunteering works with people aged 18-25 to support people to get skills for jobs and volunteering roles.
