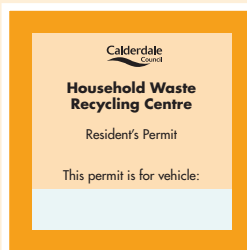


The Council has introduced two changes to the Household Waste Recycling Centres (HWRCs). This is so that we can manage the costs of waste disposal and operating the Centres.

We need to make significant savings and introducing these changes will help achieve this while at the same time ensuring that all Household Waste Recycling Centres remain open and continue to operate their existing hours.

Resident Permit Scheme for Brighouse and Elland Household Waste Recycling Centres

The Council is introducing a **resident permit scheme** on a trial basis to allow access onto **Brighouse** and **Elland** HWRCs for disposal of household waste. The permit scheme will allow easier access for Calderdale residents by deterring any visitors from outside the borough from using the HWRCs. The HWRCs at **Halifax, Sowerby Bridge** and **Todmorden** are currently unaffected.



Every vehicle visiting Brighouse or Elland HWRC will need a resident permit in order to deposit waste or recycling. If you have more than one vehicle at your household, each vehicle will need a separate permit. The vehicle registration number will be written on the permit at the time of issue.

Permits will be issued free of charge by the site office at either Brighouse or Elland HWRC, on production of photo identification to prove residence in Calderdale. Please show your valid driving licence and a utility bill no more than 3 months old.

You must display the permit in your vehicle when using Brighouse or Elland HWRCs. Photocopies will not be accepted.

Please Note: The resident permit is separate to the van permit scheme already in operation at all of our HWRCs.

New charges for plasterboard, hardcore and rubble

The Council has no obligation to accept these types of waste as they are not classed as household waste. However, Calderdale residents may take small quantities from their home to one of the three HWRCs which will accept this waste.



Halifax, Todmorden and **Brighouse** HWRCs will accept a maximum of 6 bags of plasterboard or hardcore and rubble per visit. The bags must be no bigger than a traditional rubble or sand bag, maximum weight of 25kg per bag.



Charges will apply to the following types of Waste:

- Ceramic pipes
- Sink/Pedestal
- Toilet/Bidet
- Bricks/Breeze Blocks
- Concrete and Paving Slabs
- Gravel/Stones/Sand
- Rubble/Hardcore/Tarmac
- Plasterboard (plasterboard skip)
- Tiles/Slates



The final decision on what constitutes plasterboard, hardcore and rubble will be made by the operative at the HWRC.

From 3 December 2018 the following charges will apply. Payments can only be accepted at the HWRC via DEBIT or CREDIT CARD.

£2.50 per bag of rubble to a maximum of 6 bags per visit

£3.00 per bag of plasterboard up to a maximum of 6 bags per visit
